A street in Naples named after the founder of Juridical Psychology

On 14 July 2003, Juridical Psychology received its formal recognition beyond the field of the specialists and scholars. The Toponymy Commission of the Town Council of Naples' Commune has agreed to the request to name a street of Naples after "the eminent lawyer and criminologist Neapolitan Enrico Altavilla".

I thanked the Mayor and the Commission, and I asked to be included in the street plaque, that Enrico Altavilla was a lawyer and a criminologist. I asked to participate in the ceremony. The commission agreed and in a meeting, held on 24 June 2003, the absolute importance of Altavilla was recognised both in criminal law and in the criminological field.

The recognition is absolutely significant because the Italian father of our discipline has received from his city an official Italian Tribute which becomes a tribute to all the country.

Another remarkable news in this review, to draw to the attention of the readers, is the organisation of a Master in Forensic Psychology at the University of Turin (Italy). The specialisation of the course and the high competence of the scholars and experts involved, deserves to be mentioned here.
