This book edited by Carponi Schittar is a guide-anthology in which the author describes meaningful pleadings and prosecutor's closing arguments. In this way Carponi Schittar shows that, though the cross-examination in the criminal trial has grown in importance as a persuasive technique towards the judge – and the author has published a lot about this – the final speech cannot be considered less interesting. It is essentially a narrative summary of what has occurred during the trial. As the author wisely points out, working in this field requires different skills: everyone has their own style, but the persuasive mark is a common element in many speeches presented in this volume.

A good chance to know or to meditate not only on significant documents of the human genius while achieving persuasive goals, but also on the historical backgrounds that caused them (Nuremberg trial, Louis XVI trial, Rosenberg trial, Graziani trial, Oscar Wilde trial, etc.).
